Regulatory Affairs

- Manage the environmental approvals and permitting programs for the Company.
- Manage financial resources required to support technical studies, field programs, and consulting teams engaged in environmental approvals.
- Liaise with government regulators and approval boards to maintain communications and ensure expedient permitting outcomes.

Environment

- Be the senior point of contact for the environmental department at the Project site and oversee and supervise the day-to-day activities of the environmental team and consultants.
- Coordinate health and safety requirements for environmental team, contractors, and consultants for implementing field programs, and spend time directly in the field as required.
- Mentor and coach environmental field crews, monitors, and consultants to ensure completion of field programs (including mentoring of strong field data collection skills).
- Lead site update engagement initiatives with Indigenous Nations as they relate to environmental and regulatory affairs.
- Support the community relations team in communication with Indigenous Nations and local communities, including travel to communities as needed.
- Implement environmental consultation and engagement programs directed at regulatory agencies, stakeholders, and Indigenous peoples required to meet all permit, reporting and social obligations.
- Ensure that all environmental and community consultation data is suitably transferred and validated, as well as securely retained in the relevant databases, and run reports as required to support regulatory applications and other reporting requirements.
- Ensure environmental management programs are in compliance with all corporate policies and procedures.
- Develop, implement, and maintain environmental data management and monitoring systems required to comply with all regulatory, permits, monitoring, and reporting requirements.
